

4101 S WHITE MOUNTAIN ROAD, SHOW LOW

Colliers International has been retained as the exclusive advisor for the fee simple interest of the White Mountain Vacation Village, which was originally developed as a 167 acre mixed-use project located in Show Low, Arizona. The project was slated for the sale of 1,100 recreational unit lots, 61 mountain lodges, and 15 fractional interest vacation homes. 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Located in the center of the project is a festival area with ponds stocked with fish for catch-and-release fishing, gazebos, picnic tables, hiking trails and work-out stations. Also included is a 6,000 SF clubhouse with flat screen televisions, stone fireplaces, hardwood floors, a kitchen, rest rooms, showers, games room, internet room, laundry facilities, as well as an outdoor pavilion and horseshoe pit. These amenities are not for sale and owned only through the property owner's association. The property, open year-round, is nestled in the tall pines and located near shopping, dining and medical facilities. The extra amenities are available for the property owner's use with the exception of the rodeo grounds and amphitheater, which can be rented for special occasions.

CITY OF SHOW LOW OVERVIEW

Show Low was named after a poker tournament played between two of its earliest settlers. Rumor is that the players determined that there was not enough room for both of them in the community and that they would play a game of cards to decide who was to get the 100,000 acre ranch, and who had to move on. According to history it is reported that one of them stated "If you can show low, you win." The other turned up the deuce of clubs and replied "Show Low it is".

The City of Show Low, Arizona is the entrance to the White Mountains for people from both Phoenix and Tucson,

and is the largest city in the White Mountain area. Show Low's major economic influence is tourism and Show Low has become one of the major second home destinations in the state. Incorporated in 1953, Show Low has a full-time population of approximately 11,000 residents which increases during the summer season to approximately 28,000 people. The average temperature of Show Low is estimated at a cool 66 degrees, with annual rainfall of around 17" per year. Show Low provides a nice reprieve for those wanting to beat the summer heat of the Phoenix and Tucson areas
